Summary

First and Second Chronicles are the first and second books of a four-book series that includes Ezra and Nehemiah. These four books provide a scribal (priestly) history of Israel from the time of Adam (1 Chron. 1:1) to the rebuilding of the house of God and the walls of Jerusalem and the restoration of the people in the worship of God according to the law of Moses (Neh. 13:31). Special focus is on the fortunes of God's house in Jerusalem upon which God has set His name forever (2 Chron. 7:16). David found Israel to be like scattered sheep. As God's chosen shepherd and line through which God would build His house, David sought to order the life of Israel around the worship of God. Under God he made the city of Jerusalem his capital (1 Chron. 11:4–9), transferred the ark of God to the city (1 Chron. 16:1), and began to prepare for the building of the temple (1 Chron. 22:1–2). Solomon, his son, built the temple (2 Chron. 2:1), and Zerubbabel, his son of succeeding generations, rebuilt the temple (Ezra 3:8). The intervening sons of David, who served as kings of Judah, were judged by whether they were faithful to God and to His house.

The Chronicler sought to encourage the postexilic community through his retelling of their history in a new way. The books of Samuel—Kings were written in the exile, and sought to explain why the exile occurred (Israel's sin), which was what their original audience needed to hear. However, the Chronicler's postexilic audience needed to be assured that the Lord was still interested in them. Chronicles seeks to encourage the restoration community by emphasizing the continuity between their current situation and the preexilic time, and underscoring their heritage as the people of God and heirs of the promises to David.

Content and Structure

1-2 Chronicles is arranged around three major sections & an epilogue:

- 1. Genealogies from Adam to David (1 Chron. 1–9)
- 2. David & Solomon-rule and reign (1 Chron. 10-29-2 Chron.1-9)
- 3. Kings of Judah—the southern kingdom (2 Chron. 10-35)
- 4. Epilogue-the exile and return (2 Chron. 36:22-23)

Key Passages

1 Chronicles 17:23–24 (ESV)²³And now, O Lord, let the word that you have spoken concerning your servant and concerning his house be established forever, and do as you have spoken, ²⁴and your name will be established and magnified forever, saying, 'The Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, is Israel's God,' and the house of your servant David will be established before you.

Whoever is among you of all his people, may the Lord his God be with him. Let him go up.' "






Solomon's Temple
